Background/Key Points: In June 2020, the city engaged the firm "Community Design Group" to complete a Bicycle and Pedestrian master plan. Antonio Rosell, of Community Design Group along with input from a citizen working group, a number of staff and a council rep. have been meeting monthly to work on the plan. Also, used in the plan development, have been aspects of public engagement including a survey, via social media and an on-line open house.

FFM Airport Entitlement Transfer Request

#### **Recommendation:**

• Authorize the transfer of FFM Airport Entitlement funds to the Red Wing Regional (RGK) Airport

#### **Background/Key Points:**

The Fergus Falls Municipal Airport receives \$150,000 per year of Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) entitlement funding to use towards justified and eligible projects at the FFM airport. The City can accrue up to four years of entitlement funds (\$600,000) to put towards a larger airport development projects. If entitlement funds are not used within four years, they are turned back to the FAA and added to the FAA discretionary funding account which can be used for a project in any airport across the country.

With the overall increase in project construction costs, Minnesota airport communities have the option to transfer their entitlement dollars to another Minnesota community which may need additional FAA funding. This ability to transfer funding allows the funding to stay in Minnesota and help neighboring communities.

The City currently has a FAA entitlement balance of \$150,000. There is no project planned for federal fiscal year 2021. In year 2022 the City planning a pavement maintenance project.

Since the City does not need access to their FAA entitlement balance this year, the Red Wing Regional Airport is requesting a transfer of funds in the amount of \$150,000 from the City of Fergus Falls in 2021 to aid in funding construction of an Apron Expansion project. As part of the transfer agreement, Red Wing agrees to pay back the \$150,000 next year. This would give the City the necessary funding back to pursue the pavement maintenance project in federal fiscal year 2022.

The attached form (5100-110) is needed for the FAA to make the transfer of entitlement dollars between the Fergus Falls Municipal Airport and the Red Wing Regional Airport. A similar agreement will be signed next year to repay the funds from the Red Wing Regional Airport to the Fergus Falls Municipal Airport.

#### Subject:

1222 N. Tower Road West Tool & Design Building Expansion

#### Recommendation:

- Authorize the solicitation of quotes
- Authorize staff to execute a storm water drainage easement

#### **Background/Key Points:**

Representatives of West Tool & Design Building contacted City staff in regards to a building expansion (80'x60') on their site. We determined modifications to storm sewer runoff are needed to facilitate the proposed building and site improvements.

Currently, storm water runoff from the 1st Avenue N. cul de sac drains via a street curb cut onto West Tool & Design's property and then flows overland across the property into the adjacent RR R/W. The proposed building expansion would inhibit this drainage and possibly create property damage if not addressed. Because of this, staff is proposing the installation of a catch basin in the cul de sac with piping to convey the runoff away from the proposed building. Please refer to the attached exhibit for additional detail.

Once quotes are received, staff will present them to this Council for final approval. Contingent on the building expansion schedule and quotes received, staff will recommend how to proceed with this work. A drainage utility easement will also need to be developed and recorded in conjunction with this work. The owner indicated their willingness consent to the said easement.

#### **Budgetary Impact:**

The estimated construction cost is \$33,000. The storm sewer enterprise fund is the proposed funding source.



#### **Background/Key Points:**

City staff has been evaluating local street candidates that will receive a bituminous overlay and seal coat application. The street locations shown on the attached map are potential candidates for 2021. Please note, the streets highlighted may not all be completed due to budgetary constraints and the existing conditions of the streets.

These two (2) types of street applications are preventative maintenance strategies contracted on an annual basis throughout the City. Per City policy, sidewalk pedestrian ramps will be improved to meet ADA standards in neighborhoods that receive a bituminous mill & overlay.

If acceptable, staff will prepare the project plans and cost estimates prior to requesting authorization to advertise for bids. This work should be completed by September 2021.

#### **Budgetary Impact:**

The estimated construction cost have not been completed at this time however, will be selecting street segments accordingly in consideration of the City's 2021 budget levy amounts. Bituminous mill & overlay are budgeted for \$244,800 and \$129,600 for seal coat applications. These budget amounts include general engineering and contingency costs.

Staff will identify additional street segments that could possibly be added into the contract if favorable bid prices are received.



City MSAS Mileage Adjustment

#### **Recommendation:**

• Revoke the MSAS Route No.s 120 & 140

#### Background/Key Points:

In April 2019, the City and Otter Tail County completed the jurisdictional street swap within the City limits. As a result of the the City has a reduced overall Trunk Highway Turnback mileage. This "category" of street mileage is considered to be over and above the maximum 20% limit on total street mileage in Fergus Falls allowed on the Municipal State Aid Street (MSAS) System. With the reduction of mileage in this particular category it is necessary to reduce our corresponding overall MSAS System mileage by 0.60 miles to remain in compliance with the MSAS Rules.

After reviewing our current MSAS System map I recommending remove the following streets in order to reduce our total MSAS System mileage. These streets have not received any recent MSAS funding and thus do not require any proportional reimbursement of said funding. These streets also have the lowest traffic counts.

With the completion of this action the City would have +0.01 miles of street available for future designation on the MSAS System. I approved, a resolution will be sent to the State for the Commissioner to approve.
