City Council Minutes May 3, 2021

The Fergus Falls City Council held a regular meeting on May 3, 2021 at 5:30 pm in the City Council Chambers. Pastor Doug Dent of Federated Church gave the invocation and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, some members of the council participated via zoon. Mayor Schierer called the meeting to order at 5:31 pm. Council members in attendance were Thompson, Arneson, Gustafson, Fish, Kvamme and Rufer. Hagberg and Hicks were absent.

Approval of Agenda

A motion and second were made by Arneson and Thompson to approve tonight's agenda as presented and the motion carried.

Bid Awarded PI 9768

City Administrator Andrew Bremseth remarked we have reached a major milestone to bring the downtown riverfront improvement project bids to the council after years of work developing the plan. Revitalizing our downtown has been the council's number one goal and he thanked those involved in the process, including donors, community partners, downtown businesses, staff and the public for their support. City Engineer Brian Yayarow reviewed the bids and said the low base bid was from local contractor Comstock Construction in the amount of \$3,028,400. Seven alternates totaling \$185,000 were included in the proposal for a total project cost of \$3,213,600. Construction on the west block and parking lot could begin this summer and be substantially completed by fall. Access would remain open for businesses located in this area. City Finance Director Bill Sonmor reviewed the project's finance plan, noting the total estimated project cost is \$6,873,564. This includes costs incurred to date, the west block, the east block and a prefabricated bridge. Proposed funding sources include \$1,750,000 in state bonding, \$1,135,000 in fundraising (Veden Charitable Trust, private fundraising, two Rotary groups and West Central Initiative); \$600,000 LCCMR grant and \$3,388,564 in city funding for a total of \$6,873,564. He reviewed the costs, timeline and funding sources for Phase I (west block and parking lot) construction in 2021 and Phase II (east block and prefabricated bridge) construction in 2022. The city's portion of the project funding is \$3,058,564. \$400,000 would come from the liquor store proceeds, \$500,000 would be used from the American Rescue Funds to stimulate contractor work in the community and the city would bond for the remaining \$2,158,564. He shared three funding scenarios and said if the city considered a 15 year bond of \$2,225,000 (after issuance and underwriting cost), it would add approximately \$33 per year more in taxes for a homeowner of a \$250,000 valued home. He said he is comfortable with the funding plan and recommended the council proceed with awarding this bid. Mayor Schierer shared his support for the project and was pleased local contractors and subcontractors would be used in the project. He spoke about the city's investment in downtown infrastructure and the support this project will provide to local downtown businesses. The last time the city made a sizeable investment in the downtown was 1989. Arneson offered Resolution #80-2021, awarding a bid for PI 9768, the Downtown Riverfront Balcony Enhancement and Stabilization Project to Comstock Construction Inc. in the amount of \$3,213,600 (base bid plus seven alternates), which was seconded by Rufer and was adopted.

Proclamation: Nurse's Month

Mayor Schierer read a proclamation declaring May as Nurses Month.

Consent Agenda

Resolution #82-2021 adding a Vendor in Parks permit and fee to the fee schedule. Resolution #83-2021 approving the purchase of a front end loader and authorizing the trade in of the current equipment. Resolution #84-2021 approving a budget adjustment for the Planning Department. Resolution #85-2021 approving a Conditional Use Permit for LRH Medical Properties LLC to expand the existing hospital at 712 S Cascade Street located in a R-2 zone. Resolution #86-2021 approving a variance for a detached accessory garage within their front and side yard for the property located at 421 Friberg Avenue as requested by Terry and Rhonda Craft. Resolution #87-2021 approving a variance to deviate from the minimum lot area and side/rear setbacks of the property located at 1901 and 2001 W Lincoln Avenue in a B-6 zone as requested by Martin Graff of the Westridge Mall Partnership LLC. Resolution #88-2021 approving a preliminary plat to subdivide two parcels of property located at 1901 and 2001 W Lincoln Avenue as requested by Martin Graff of the Westridge Mall Partnership. Resolution #89-2021 granting the city's consent to have Broken Down Dam designated as a local landmark site. The resolution was seconded by Arneson and was adopted.

Kvamme requested the minutes from the April 28 Committee of the Whole meeting be pulled from the consent agenda. At that meeting, staff stated the MPCA has proposed increasing the city's stormwater management permit from \$400 every five years to \$20,000 every five years (\$4,000 per year) and felt the city should voice their opposition to such a steep increase. Kvamme also suggested perhaps the MPCA should consider reducing their program costs. It was noted the fee has not yet been implemented, but the city's concerns would be passed along. A motion and second were made by Thompson and Gustafson approving the open and closed minutes from the April 19, 2021 City Council meeting and the minutes from the April 28, 2021 Committee of the Whole meeting.

Mayor Schierer requested the naming of the dog park be pulled off the consent agenda to bring additional attention to the park which is schedule to be open by June of this year. The land the park will be located was donated to the city by the Adams family. The park is being named in honor of the Adams' family dog, Higgins. Gustafson offered Resolution #90-2021 approving the naming of the dog park as Higgins Dog Park, which was seconded by Kvamme and was adopted.

Ordinance 7

The Charter Commission has recommended City Code 31.08 be amended to reflect an interim emergency succession plan for the council if there is a catastrophic event and all of the members of the City Council are gone. Ordinance 7, Eighth Series, Amending City Code Chapter 31.08, Interim Emergency Succession, was introduced by Arneson and was declared to have its first reading.

Ordinance 12

Ordinance 12, Eighth Series, Ordering the vacation of the Highland Avenue right-of-way in the Guttenberg Addition and a part of Pioneer Road in the Village Cooperative Addition was adopted by a roll call vote.

Land Sale Introduction

Lonnie Ballweg, the property owner of 2306 Southview Drive requested the city to sell him a two acre parcel so they can construct a private shop. The property adjoins to land they already own and this would become one parcel. The city has no future plans for this undeveloped land. A local realtor has performed a market analysis that supports the proposed price of \$35,000 for this parcel. The Ballweg's have paid for a survey so a boundary and legal description have been established. All future use of this property must comply with all city zoning ordinances. The City Charter states the sale city property must be conducted over two meetings, with a minimum of ten days between meetings. Thompson offered Resolution #91-2021 introducing a land sale of approximately 2.06 acres of city property to Lonnie and Danielle Ballweg on Southview Drive, which was seconded by Rufer and was adopted.

Resolution of Accounts

Fish offered a resolution authorizing the payments and claims in the amount of \$692,911.38, which was seconded by Gustafson and was adopted.

May 12, 2021 Committee of the Whole

The Fergus Falls City Council met as a Committee of the Whole on May 12, 2021 at 7:00 am in the City Council Chambers. Mayor Schierer called the meeting to order and the following council members were in attendance: Thompson, Arneson, Gustafson, Hicks, Fish, Hagberg, Kvamme and Rufer.

Rolling Meadows Plat Stormwater Agreement

The future owner of Lot 2 in the Rolling Meadows Plat is requesting to deed an existing stormwater pond (Outlot A) to the city, and this land conveyance could be facilitated by a quit claim deed. The existing and future owners of Lots 1 and 2 will be required to enter into a Stormwater Pond Agreement with the city. These owners will assume full responsibility for the regular maintenance of this lot including mowing, picking up litter and managing weeds. The city would be responsible for on-going monitoring, necessary repairs and/or sediment removal for water quality purposes. To complete the arrangement, the owner of Lot 1 will dedicate a 20' wide ingress/egress easement along the south side for the entire length of Lot 1 to provide city access to the pond area (Outlot A). The owner would be responsible for the reimbursement of the City Attorney's services and recording fees and no fencing would be required. This transaction helps the city's stormwater management program as our ordinance requires the monitoring of ponds. This agreement is necessary to clearly outline the roles and responsibilities of each party. A motion and second were made by Arneson and Fish to recommend the council accept the conveyance of a stormwater pond (Outlot A) to the city contingent on the authorization for the City Engineer and City Attorney to prepare the Storm Water Maintenance Agreement and preparation of the ingress/egress easement to allow city access to Outlot A and the motion carried.

Pebble Lake Golf Course Wetland Delineation

The city has been meeting with members of the Pebble Lake Golf Course, and the Minnesota Board of Water and Soil Resources to discuss on-going golf course water issues that have hindered course operations for many years. A number of water mitigation and drainage improvements have been discussed and some golf course wetlands must be delineated so any improvements the city makes do not violate the Wetland Conservation Act regulations. The delineation report will assist with the identification of cost effective course improvements and planning. Stantec would provide this report at a cost of \$8,050 and the proposed funding source is either the American Rescue Funds or the storm sewer enterprise fund. The City Engineer explained the certification required for engineering firms to have to conduct wetland delineations. A motion and second were made by Fish and Rufer to recommend the council initiate PI 7766, the Pebble Lake Golf Course delineation and drainage improvement project and to accept Stantec's professional services proposal for wetland delineation in the amount of \$8,050 and the motion carried.

CP 5955

May 25 is the scheduled date for the bid opening for CP 5955, the 2021 street and utility improvement project for the Whitford Street and Bancroft Avenue area. If the bids are favorable, the lower responsible bidder's itemized costs will be utilized to prepare the final assessment rolls for each affected property owner. Final assessment notices would be issued prior to the final cost hearing. The council would need to decide if they award the construction contract contingent upon potential objections at the final cost hearing. A motion and second were made by Gustafson and Thompson to recommend

the council set the final cost assessment hearing date for CP 5955 for June 21, 2021 at 5:30 pm in the City Council Chambers and the motion carried.

Pavement Management

Earlier this year the council requested staff provide an overview of the city's street conditions and the funding for street improvements. In an interview setting, City Engineer Brian Yavarow explained how our fluctuating temperatures, traffic volumes and time creates wear and tear on the streets. Proper maintenance can extend the useful life of a road, but eventually all roads must be replaced. The city has 100 miles of paved roadway to maintain plus alleys and gravel roads. Yavarow reviewed the processes the Engineering Department uses to evaluate the street conditions, how they prioritize which projects are to be completed and what funding sources are available. Examples of deterioration and preservation methods used by the city were shared. In 2021, the council approved spending nearly \$130,000 for seal coat projects and almost \$250,000 for mill and overlay work. This amount of funding the council has allocated to street improvements has increased significantly over the past few years and the project work is divided by city wards. Solutions for additional funding for streets were discussed including franchise fees. The city would need to work with our local utility companies to implement a fee for their access in the city's right-of-way. The fees would, by ordinance, require 100% of the funding to be dedicated to street improvement projects and would complement the amount of funding the city is already dedicating to street projects.

The council asked a number of questions including how we can get ahead of the curve on street projects and how much money would be required to fix all of the roadways. Yavarow stated even if the city had unlimited funds, the underlying utility conditions play a major role in determining how extensive an improvement is necessary and that greatly affects the overall cost. Fixing the infrastructure beneath our streets is dependent on the types of materials available, their cost, the weather, and the soil conditions. This presentation will be shared on the city's website and social media to inform our residents how the city prioritizes street improvement projects.

The meeting adjourned at 7:57 am

- Authorize the City Engineer and City Attorney to prepare the Ingress/Egress Easement to allow City access to Outlot A

Background/Key Points:

The future owner of Lot 2, located in the Rolling Meadows Plat, is requesting to deed an existing stormwater pond (Outlot A) to the City. This land conveyance could be facilitated by quit claim deed.

If acceptable, the existing and future owners of Lot 1 & 2 will be required to enter into a Stormwater Pond Agreement with the City. In general similar to past arrangements, the existing and future owner of Lot 1 and Lot 2, will assume full responsibility for the "Regular" maintenance of the pond area (Outlot A). "Regular" maintenance being defined as mowing, picking up litter, etc. The City will be responsible for on-going monitoring, necessary repairs, and/or sediment removal to maintain design capacity for water quality purposes. The existing and future owners have consented to the City's conditions thus far.

Additionally, in order to complete this arrangement, the owner of Lot 1 will dedicate to the City a 20' wide Ingress/Egress easement along the south side for the entire length of said Lot 1, to provide City access to the pond area (Outlot A). Please refer to the attached exhibit for further detail.

I recommend the City Council authorize staff to execute the recommendations as presented.

General staff is required to complete this request. The Owner(s) will need to agree to reimburse the City for attorney and recording fees.

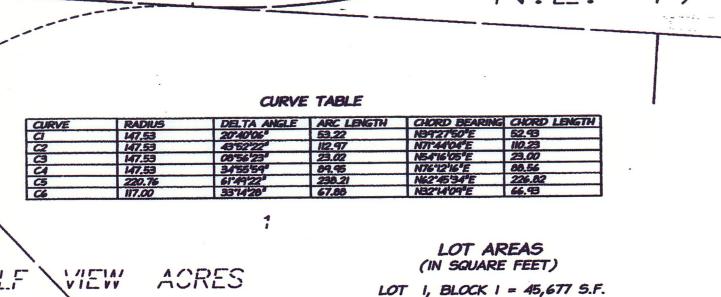

Recommendation: Please approve the consent to assignment of the investment management agreement between the City of Fergus Falls and Galliard Capital Management, Inc. to GTCR LLC and Reverence Capital Partners, L.P.

Background/Key Points:

The City of Fergus Falls has contracted for investment management services with Galliard Capital Management, Inc. since September 29, 2006. Galliard has provided a valuable service to the City and we have been consistently pleased with their management of the City's investment portfolio. Galliard has been a subsidiary of Wells Fargo Asset Management (WFAM) Holdings, LLC.

The parent company of WFAM Holdings LLC has entered into an agreement to sell 100% of the equity interests in WFAM Holdings LLC to a new parent company that is an affiliate of funds managed by GTCR LLC and Reverence Capital Partners, L.P., each of which is a private equity firm with experience investing in asset management businesses.

The change in ownership and organization form of Galliard will have no impact on the investment management services the City receives or the terms of our agreement.

Galliard is requesting the City's consent to the assignment.

<u>Budgetary Impact:</u> There will be no impact to the budget. The terms of the existing investment management agreement will remain unchanged.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF FERGUS FALLS, MINNESOTA, AMENDING CITY CODE CHAPTER 31.08 INTERIM EMERGENCY SUCCESSION.

THE CITY OF FERGUS FALLS DOES ORDAIN:

<u>Section 1.</u> City Code Chapter 31.08, Interim Emergency Succession, is hereby amended to read as follows:

§31.08 INTERIM EMERGENCY SUCCESSION.

- (A) *Purpose*. Due to the existing possibility of a **catastrophic event** nuclear attack or a natural disaster requiring a declaration of a state of emergency, it is found urgent and necessary to ensure the continuity of duly elected and lawful leadership of the city to provide for the continuity of the government and the emergency interim succession of key governmental officials by providing a method for temporary emergency appointments to their offices.
- (B) Succession to local offices. In the event of a catastrophic event nuclear attack upon the United States or a natural disaster affecting the vicinity of the city, the Mayor, Council and City Administrator shall be forthwith notified by any one of these persons, and by any means available, to gather at the City Hall. In the event that safety or convenience dictate, an alternative place of meeting may be designated. In the event the Mayor and Council are unable to be present, the Charter Commission shall be notified by any means available to gather at the City Hall or other designated meeting location. Those gathered shall proceed as follows.

(C) Those gathered shall proceed as follows:

- (1) By majority vote of those persons present, regardless of number, they shall elect a Chairperson and Secretary to preside and keep minutes, respectively.
- (2) They shall review and record the specific facts relating to the **catastrophic event** nuclear attack or natural disaster and injuries to persons or damage to property already done, or the imminence thereof.
- (3) They may, based on facts, declare a state of emergency. If a state of emergency is thus declared, then the following provisions in (a) and (b) will be enacted:
- (a) By a majority vote of those persons present, regardless of the number, they shall fill all positions on the Council (including the office of Mayor) of those persons upon whom notice could not be served or who are unable to be present.

PURCHASE AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT ("<u>Agreement</u>") made and entered into as of the 18th day of May 2021, by and between the **City of Fergus Falls**, a Minnesota municipal corporation, whose address is 112 West Washington Avenue, Fergus Falls, MN 56537 (the "<u>Seller</u>"), and **Lonnie Ballweg and Danielle Ballweg**, whose address is 2306 Southview Drive, Fergus Falls, Minnesota 56537 (the "**Buyer**").

- 1. <u>Real Property</u>. Seller agrees to sell, and Buyer agrees to purchase, upon the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth, real property located in Fergus Falls, Otter Tail County, Minnesota, and legally described on <u>Exhibit A</u>, together with all improvements and appurtenances belonging thereto (the "<u>Real Property</u>").
- 2. **Purchase Price**. The purchase price shall be Thirty-Five Thousand Dollars and No/00 (\$35,000.00) payable in cash or certified funds at closing.
- 3. <u>Contingencies</u>. The terms of this Agreement are contingent upon certain conditions, referred to as "contingencies", being met on or before the date of closing, which contingencies are set forth as follows:

There are no contingencies.

- 4. <u>Title, Liens and Encumbrances</u>. At closing, Seller shall transfer title to the Real Property to the Buyer by a Quit Claim Deed conveying Seller's title to the Buyer. The sale and transfer by Quit Claim Deed shall be free of all liens and encumbrances except for the following:
 - (a) Building and zoning laws, ordinances, including local, state and federal regulations.
- 5. <u>Title Examination</u>. The Buyer may procure its own expense a title insurance commitment and final owner's policy and shall provide a copy of the commitment within 7 days of it being issued. If the commitment shows that title to the Real Property is unmarketable, the Seller may elect (at Seller's sole discretion) to either terminate this Agreement or correct title to the Real Property and make it marketable. If the title to the Real Property cannot be made marketable within 90 days of being provided a copy of the commitment this Agreement shall be wholly null, void, and unenforceable, unless the Buyer waives its objections and proceeds to close. If Buyer proceeds to closing with or without title insurance commitment or final owner's policy, Buyer shall be deeded to waive any objections to title. The closing may be extended by agreement of the Seller to permit the Seller a sufficient time to correct any title defects. However, if title defects cannot be corrected within that timeframe, this Agreement shall terminate. The cost of the title insurance commitment and final policy shall be paid for by Buyer.
- 6. <u>Closing</u>. Closing of this transaction shall take place and possession of said premises shall be delivered to the Buyer on or before the 15th day of June 2021 (the "<u>Closing</u>

<u>Date</u>"), subject to the extension of time heretofore granted if title to such premises shall be found unmarketable. The closing shall be handled by the law office of Nycklemoe & Ellig, P.A. located at 106 East Washington Avenue, Fergus Falls, Minnesota 56537. No in person closing shall be required as closing documents shall be transmitted by mail, email, or fax and money shall be wired between the parties.

- 7. <u>Real Estate Taxes and Assessments</u>. The Seller agrees to pay all real estate taxes and assessments for special improvements levied or assessed for the year prior to closing and prior years. Real estate taxes, and assessments for special improvements for the year of closing shall be prorated between the Buyer and the Seller, and in the event the exact amount of the taxes and assessments for the year of closing are not yet known, the amount to be prorated shall be based on the real estate taxes and assessments for special improvements for the year prior to closing. Buyer agrees to pay the real estate taxes and assessments for special improvements accruing after closing and all subsequent years.
- 8. <u>Buyer Representations</u>. Buyer hereby represents to Seller that Buyer has the full and complete authority to enter into this Agreement, and that the individuals executing this Agreement on behalf of Buyer have the legal and organizational authority to execute this Agreement on behalf of Buyer and to bind Buyer.
- 9. <u>Seller Covenants, Warranties and Representations</u>. Seller provides the following warranties, covenants, and representations, which shall be effective as of the date of this Agreement and as of the date of closing:
 - (a) Seller has the legal and organizational authority to enter into this Agreement and to sell the Real Property, and that the individuals executing this Agreement on its behalf have the legal and organizational authority to execute this Agreement on behalf of Seller and to bind Seller.
 - (b) No consent or approval of any person, entity, or governmental agency or authority is required with respect to the execution and delivery of this Agreement by Seller and, as of the Closing Date, no such consent or approval will be required with respect to the sale by Seller of the Real Property to Buyer.
 - (c) Seller has not received notice from any governmental authority of any violation affecting any portion of the Real Property.
 - (d) There are no outstanding, pending, or, to the best of Seller's knowledge and belief, threatened suits, judgments, condemnation proceedings, zoning changes, or any other proceedings pending or of record in any court of any nature respecting the Real Property;

- (e) As of the Closing Date, there will be no recorded or unrecorded liens, mortgages, security interests, security agreements, or UCC financing statements, against the Real Property or any part thereof.
- 10. <u>Well Disclosure</u>. Seller certifies that there are no wells on the Real Property.
- 11. <u>Public Utilities, City Water and Sewer Disclosure</u>. Seller discloses there are no public utilities, including water or sewer, serving the Real Property.
- 12. <u>Title and Real Property sold "AS IS" "WHERE IS"</u>. The Real Property is sold without warranty or representation as to title and Buyer accepts the property in its "AS IS" and "WHERE IS" condition including all faults known or unknown.
 - 13. <u>Documents and Deliverables for Closing</u>.
 - (a) Seller shall furnish the following documents at the time of closing:
 - i. Quit Claim Deed.
 - ii. Any Certificate of Real Estate Value or Fair Consideration required by the applicable state agencies.
 - iii. Any documents required which are necessary to convey good and marketable title, free of any encumbrances or liens, and otherwise consistent with this Agreement.
 - (b) Buyer shall deliver the following at Closing:
 - i. Purchase price payable in cash or certified funds.
 - ii. Any other document required by this agreement.
- 14. **Possession.** At closing, Seller will deliver possession of the Real Property to Buyer.
- 15. <u>Allocation of Closing Expenses</u>. The parties shall apportion the Closing expenses in the following manner:
 - (a) Seller's expenses Seller shall be responsible for:
 - i. Transfer tax, if any, connected with the recording of the Quit Claim Deed;
 - ii. The recording fees for any corrective instruments;

- iii. Its own attorney's fees;
- iv. One-half of the total anticipated \$400.00 closing fee charged by the Closing Agent, and
- v. All other costs specifically allocated to the Seller as set forth in this Agreement.
- (b) Buyer's expenses Buyer shall be responsible for:
 - i. Recording fees for the Quit Claim Deed;
 - ii. Its own attorney's fees, including fees for title opinions;
 - iii. The cost of an owner's title insurance policy;
 - iv. One-half of the total anticipated \$400.00 closing fee charged by the Closing Agent, and
 - v. All other costs specifically allocated to the Buyer as set forth in this Agreement, including but not limited to, ALTA survey costs, lender fees and appraisals, and environmental site assessments, if any.
- 16. <u>Real Property to permanently attach to adjacent land</u>. Buyer is the current owner of real property described in that Warranty Deed dated February 28, 2020, filed March 4, 2020 and recorded in the Office of the County Recorder, Otter Tail County, Minnesota as Document #1234277, which is adjacent to the Real Property described in Exhibit A. Buyer agrees that the Real Property described in Exhibit A shall be permanently attached to the real property described in Document #1234277 as if to make one lot which shall not be subdivided at any time after closing.
- 17. <u>Default</u>. If Buyer fails to perform any of the terms or conditions of this Agreement within the specified time limits, Seller may, at Seller's option, declare this Agreement terminated or have this Agreement specifically enforced. Likewise, if Seller fails to perform any of the terms or conditions of this Agreement within the specified time limits, Buyer may declare this Agreement terminated or Buyer may have this Agreement specifically enforced. The rights and remedies granted to the parties in this Section are intended to be cumulative to all other rights and remedies available to the parties (whether under this Agreement, at law, in equity or otherwise); accordingly, the exercise by either party of any such right or remedy shall not preclude it from exercising any other such right or remedy.
- 18. <u>Time of the Essence</u>. Time is of the essence of each provision of this entire Agreement and all of the conditions thereof.

- 19. <u>Modification</u>. No change or modification of this Agreement shall be valid unless the same be in writing and signed by all the parties to this Agreement.
- 20. <u>Persons Bound by this Agreement</u>. This Agreement shall be binding upon the parties, their heirs, devisees, and legal representatives., This Agreement may not be assigned by the either party without each party's prior written consent. The rights and obligations of any party to this Agreement may be exercised or satisfied by that party's legal representative.
- 21. <u>Governing Law</u>. The provisions of this Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the state of Minnesota.
- 22. <u>Condemnation</u>. If prior to the Date of Closing, a public or private entity with the power of eminent domain commences condemnation proceedings against all or any part of the Real Property, Seller will promptly notify Buyer, and Buyer may, at Buyer's sole option, terminate this Agreement.
- 23. <u>Casualty Loss</u>. Until the Date of Closing, the risk of loss for the Real Property is on Seller.
- 24. <u>Mutual Indemnification</u>. Seller will indemnify and hold Buyer harmless from all liabilities (including reasonable attorneys' fees in defending against claims) arising out of claims by third parties relating to acts or occurrences on, at or with respect to the Real Property which occur prior to the closing, unless such claims relate to acts by Buyer or its agents. Buyer will indemnify and hold Seller harmless from all liabilities (including reasonable attorney fees in defending against claims) arising out of claims by third parties relating to acts or occurrences on, at or with respect to the Real Property which occur on or after the closing unless such claims relate to acts by Seller or its agents.
- 25. <u>Signature in Counterparts</u>. This Agreement may be signed in counterparts, each of which shall be an original, with the same effect as if the signatures thereto and hereto were upon the same instrument. The parties hereto confirm that any facsimile or scanned copy of another party's executed counterpart of this Agreement (or its signature page thereof) will be deemed to be an executed original thereof.

Background/Key Points:

In the past, the council has declared Summerfest, the Over the River Festival and the Shop Move and Groove event as a community festivals and the city has agreed to waive certain charges (barricades, garbage, picnic tables etc...) for these events.

The State of Minnesota allows qualifying non-profits and small breweries an opportunity to apply for a temporary liquor permit which allows them to sell liquor at 12 events per calendar year, with a minimum of 30 days in between events. If the city submits an annual resolution declaring events as community festivals, it would allow these businesses a caveat that these special events would not count in those 12 allowed licenses.
